# About us.....

- ▶ Established as 'Busy Bees' since 2000
- ▶ Seahouses is a coastal village in a rural area with a strong tourist trade
- ▶ 26 place nursery for children aged from 6 weeks to 4 years old open 47 weeks of the year on site of local Primary School
- ▶ 50 early years children on role at present
- ▶ After school & holiday provision
- ▶ Not for profit organisation
- ▶ Employ 5 full time staff & 2 part time



# Numbers

<b>2 Year old funding</b>	<b>10</b>

# Our Stretched Offer

38 weeks x 30 hours = 1140 hours per year  
1140 hours per year ÷ 47 weeks we are open =  
24 ¼ hours per week

Several factors led to us making the decision to only give parents the option of a stretched offer

- ▶ Capacity (number of places)
- ▶ Staffing
- ▶ All year round sustainability



# Flexibility

To be as flexible as feasibly possible and still be sustainable and maintain appropriate staffing levels we sell childcare in blocks over the day – we decided to stick to these blocks when offering free childcare to parents (both 15hrs & 30hrs)

# Early Implementation Pilot Scheme

## CHALLENGES

- ▶ Summer Term
  - High number of summer birthdays & additional funding released – more families eligible
- ▶ Capacity limited to 26 children per session – waiting list
- ▶ Income (funding £4/fees £4.33)
- ▶ Supporting parents to consider their choices
- ▶ Offering flexibility but still remain financially sustainable
- ▶ Staffing

## BENEFITS

- ▶ Busier – employing more staff
- ▶ Improved service for families
- ▶ Stability/continuity of care for children
- ▶ Improved GLD for children with support of Early Years teacher in setting
- ▶ SEND children benefit from continuous input without long school holiday breaks (stretched offer)



# Moving Forward

- ▶ NCC successful capital funding bid will allow us to move with Primary School to new site into larger premises increasing capacity to provide more places for 30 hours
- ▶ Continue to develop collaboration with Primary School and establish a 'Seahouses Early Years and Childcare Partnership'
- ▶ Liaise with school early years team in joint planning and moderation to fully support children who attend both settings
- ▶ Develop seamless transitions for children between nursery and school
- ▶ Work with school to expand services /opening hours
- ▶ Expand and develop our staff team
- ▶ Look at flexibility of offer (30 hours per week in term time only also)





# Any Advice?

- ▶ Partnerships are key
  - Work with school/other local providers to establish who will provide what and where from the outset and to develop new & extended provision
  - Benefit from joint staff training, CPD opportunities, share ideas and practice.
- ▶ Give parents as much information as possible and in a variety of forms
- ▶ Make sure all parents understand their options
- ▶ Be as flexible as possible within bounds of sustainability
- ▶ Know who to speak to at County Council for help
- ▶ Read government/local council guidance documentation and develop clear policy for your setting.
